***Note:** Work Expense Reimbursements are contingent upon LandAjob receiving funds from the Social Security Administration (SSA.) LandAjob will process a reimbursement when a Beneficiary submits copies of pay stubs, which will allow us to verify that an individual has earned the necessary gross monthly income (before taxes.) We will also ask for copies of work-related expense receipts for the same time period. SSA requires that this documentation be provided in order to trigger the reimbursements to an assigned Ticket to Work Beneficiary through LandAjob.

We cannot process a reimbursement without this documentation.

We will provide you with instructions on how to submit pay stubs and work related expense receipts once your Individual Work Plan (IWP) has been completed and your Ticket to Work has been assigned to LandAjob.

- The notations marked as \$850 above were equal to \$840 in 2017
- The notations marked as \$1,180 above were equal to \$1,170 in 2017
- The notations marked as \$1,970 above were equal to \$1,950 in 2017

****Eligibility** for the entire reimbursement schedule listed above can vary by Ticket to Work Beneficiary. Previous earnings, work with a state Vocational Rehabilitation Office or another Employment Network can affect the amount of reimbursements that are available. In order to prevent Social Security Administration/Ticket to Work overpayments, LandAjob will work with you to calculate where you begin receiving reimbursements.
